Facing Up to Our Sin before God

Reading of God's Standard:

Over the next few weeks, we continue to focus on what our Lord taught about prayer. God's Word is always our standard. We are also reading together questions from our Westminster Shorter Catechism, written in London in 1646-1647, as it provides a helpful way for us to read together a summary of what this Scripture is teaching us, but it is always "subject to and subordinate to the Scriptures." This edition of the catechism in Modern English was published in 1986.

Matthew 6:9

"Pray then like this: 'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.'"

Westminster Shorter Catechism Q. 101

Q. 101. For what do we pray in the first request?

A. In the first request (hallowed be your name) we pray that God will enable us and others to glorify him in everything he uses to make himself known and that he will work out everything to his own glory.

Celebration of the Lord's Supper

Invitation & Warning

Hershey Presbyterian Church (PCA) welcomes to receive the Holy Supper all baptized Christians who actively trust in Jesus Christ for salvation, who are willing to forsake their sin and obey Christ, and who are members in good standing of an evangelical church that proclaims the gospel or who have been approved by our Session after indicating a desire to participate (BCO 58-4). Children should await communicant membership before participating.

Let this table, and our communion together, point you to Jesus—to receive grace from him, to hold out your empty and faltering hands to him, to allow him to feed and strengthen you, and to remind you that He is *for you* and *will help you* as you seek to follow him this week.

If you are not a believer in Jesus today, we are glad that you are here with us this morning! We ask you not to participate in this part of the service. We do invite you to stay and observe this celebration of the Christian's union with the risen Jesus. As the bread and wine are received by the congregation, we invite you to cry out to Jesus and pray the following prayer (or one like it):

Prayer of Belief: "Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared to admit, but in Jesus I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared to hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you and rest on you alone for my salvation."

Have prayed this prayer for the first time this morning? Please share that with a friend or talk with our pastor who can help you take the next steps in the faith.

Words of Institution:

1 Corinthians 11:23-26

"[T]he Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said,

In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying,


'This cup is the new covenant in my blood.
