"This painting presents the meeting between Mary and her cousin Elizabeth, as recounted in the Bible. Both women are pregnant—Elizabeth's son will be John the Baptist and Mary will give birth to Jesus. According to the story, Elizabeth is filled with the Holy Spirit when the future mother of Christ arrives and John the Baptist kicks joyfully in his mother's womb in response to Christ's presence. The artist includes the viewer in this private moment by bringing Elizabeth and the table close to the picture plane and placing them at the viewer's level. The intimate space and dramatic use of light and shade, especially the shadow cast by Elizabeth's form, heighten the emotion of the scene. Religion always played an important role in Henry Ossawa Tanner's life. With the artistic freedom he found in Europe, this African-American artist built a successful career and international reputation. From the 1890s until the end of his life, Tanner painted exclusively religious scenes."

*Confession of Faith:

The Nicene Creed

We confess our common faith today with the Nicene Creed, a summary of the Bible's teaching about God, our need of a sufficient Savior, and our dependence on the work of the Spirit. From the Trinity Hymnal: "The Nicene Creed originated at the Council of Nicea (325), and an expanded form was adopted by the Council of Chalcedon (451). It was formulated to answer heresies that denied the biblical doctrine of the Trinity and of the person of Christ."

We believe in one God, the Father Almighty,

Maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God,

begotten of his Father before all worlds,

God of God, Light of Light,

very God of very God,*

begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father;

by whom all things were made;

who for us and for our salvation

came down from heaven,

and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary,

and was made man;

and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered and was buried:

and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures,

and ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; and he shall come again, with glory, to judge both the living and the dead;

whose kingdom shall have no end.

And we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life,

who proceeds from the Father and the Son;

who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified;

who spoke by the prophets;

and we believe in one holy catholic** and apostolic church;

we acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins;

and we look for the resurrection of the dead,

and the life of the world to come.

^{*} The term "very God of very God" can also be translated that Lord Jesus Christ is "true God from true God."

^{** &}quot;'Catholic' here means universal; that is, there is one church across all times, places, and peoples."

Hebrews 13:12-16

Receiving Provision from God

Celebration of the Lord's Supper

Invitation & Warning

Hershey Presbyterian Church (PCA) welcomes to receive the Holy Supper all baptized Christians who actively trust in Jesus Christ for salvation, who are willing to forsake their sin and obey Christ, and who are members in good standing of an evangelical church that proclaims the gospel or who have been approved by our Session after indicating a desire to participate (BCO 58-4). Children should await communicant membership before participating.

Let this table, and our communion together, point you to Jesus—to hold out your empty and faltering hands to him, to receive grace from him, to allow him to feed and strengthen you, and to remind you that, if you are in Christ, He is *for you* and *will help you* as you seek to follow him this week.

If you are not a believer in Jesus today, we are glad that you are here with us this morning! We invite you to stay and observe this part of the service, but ask that you do not participate. It is a celebration of the Christian's union with the risen Jesus. As the bread and wine are received by the congregation, we invite you to cry out to Jesus and pray the following prayer (or one like it):

Prayer of Belief: "Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared to admit, but in Jesus I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared to hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you and rest on you alone for my salvation."

Have you prayed this prayer for the first time this morning? If so, let someone near you know! Also, feel free to talk with our pastor who can suggest ways for you to take next steps in the faith.

1 Corinthians 11:23-26

"[T]he Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, 'This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.'


In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'

Receiving of the Elements



Advent is the four-week season that begins the year in the Church calendar. As we celebrate some of the key events in the life of Jesus Christ our Savior each year, we are reminded that Jesus is the Good News. The Good News is our message. Proclaiming the Good News to the world and making disciples who follow Jesus is our mission.

Advent is a time focused on anticipating the arrival or "advent" of Jesus, our long-awaited Messiah. In these weeks, we particularly focus on our Lord's first coming into the world, and we look forward to his return. Many Christians throughout the world celebrate this special time of year.

During the four weeks of Advent as we gather for regular Lord's Day worship each Sunday, and on Christmas Eve, we read an Old Testament passage of Scripture and light candles on an Advent wreath before our regular worship service begins. The Scripture readings remind us of God's promises that are fulfilled in Christ.

Traditionally three of the four outer candles on the Advent wreath are purple; one is pink, lit on the third week of Advent. Purple is primarily used because the color violet has been used as a liturgical color to signify a time of prayer and repentance. Pink is used on the third week because the color rose has been used as a liturgical color to signify a time of joy. Advent is a wonderful season to give yourself anew to prayer, repentance, and to finding your joy in Christ.

The coming of Jesus Christ, and his subsequent work on our behalf, brings:

Hope—as we renew our anticipation and longing for the coming of the Messiah.

Peace—as we remember the words of the angels at Jesus's birth: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!" (Luke 2:14)

Joy—as we remember and take up the anthem "Joy to the world, the Lord is come, let earth receive her King!"

Love—as we remember that the birth of Christ is a demonstration of God's love: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

On Christmas Eve we will light the white, center candle, sometimes called the **Christ candle.** As we do, we remember that Jesus is the Light of the World.

He has come...and he will come again!
All glory be to God! May you know his peace this year!
